## "As Much as They Could Understand"

e now have some 200 Bible stories translated and voiced in Mandarin, Swahili, Spanish, and Arabic. The Mandarin stories have begun to be distributed on USBs in mainland China and Hong Kong. The Swahili stories are on radio in Kenya, and we praise God for the response. Seven hundred children in a refugee camp listen eagerly to the Bible stories every Saturday morning, some with their family. In South America TWR has a network of Spanish radio stations broadcasting the stories in Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Peru, and Venezuela. This is a good beginning. Many of the stories are now translated and voiced in Spanish, ready for the time when God opens further doors for the spreading of the stories across South America. The same is true for the spreading of the stories in Arabic. Please pray for these open doors. The important thing is that many of the stories are ready – translated and voiced – for future expansion.

We are now completing the stories of the trial and death of the Lord Jesus. These stories will help children and young people. We will follow the example of the Lord Jesus. He taught people in simple, everyday talk. And He taught them "as much as they could understand" (Mark 4:33 NIV).
